

Prayer Sheet

Prayer is a conversation with God not a formula. Yet sometimes we might need to use a method to freshen our prayer time. Here is a "Five-Finger Prayer" to use as a guide when praying for others:

1. When you fold your hands, the thumb is nearest to you . So begin by praying for those closest to you - your loved ones.
(Phil.1:3-5)
2. The index finger is the pointer. Pray for those who teach - Bible teachers and preachers, and those who teach children.
(1 Thess. 5:25)
3. The next finger is the tallest. It reminds you to pray for those in authority over you - national and local leaders, and supervisors at work.
(1 Tim. 2:1,2)
4. The fourth finger is usually the weakest. Pray for those who are in trouble or who are suffering.
(James 5:13-16)
5. Then comes your little finger. It reminds you of your smallness in relation to God's greatness. Ask Him to supply your needs.
(Phil. 4:6,19)

Finally ask God to give you the wisdom to know how to pray for others and remember God loves to hear from us!

Peace and Justice Talk - Wednesday 13th September at 19:30: Chernobyl Children's Lifeline (CCLL)

Jacqueline Niven and family will be talking on the activities of Fife Link, a small part of the CCLL, to remind us of the events of Chernobyl and the effect it still has on their young people. They are raising awareness of the importance of a recuperative holiday for these children and highlighting the support from local individuals, community groups and businesses with fundraising, hosting and a programme of events.

Fairtrade - A number of large supermarkets are dropping the Fairtrade goods and instead offering their own 'labels' claiming fair trade. Sainsbury's is the largest retailer of Fairtrade products in the UK. **Sainsbury's has abandoned Fairtrade certification to set up its own pilot scheme**, saying they want to secure their supply chain. 'Fairly Traded' sounds a lot like Fairtrade, but it doesn't have the same gold standards. It is self-run by Sainsbury's but most importantly it takes control away from tea farmers. And communities which benefitted from Fairtrade are being adversely affected. The slightly higher cost of Fairtrade products is to offer a fair price to growers, and to help the communities regain dignity as well as independence. **The new scheme is untested, unverified and unwanted and the 'Fairly Traded' label is likely to mislead customers.**
