Sunday - STORED MESSAGE: Let's remember what we've heard in the service today and pray round the message in the hymns we've sung, the thoughts in the sermon we've heard and the conversations we've shared with people.

Monday - ALARM: Let's remember to start our days with prayer, before all the worries and distractions of life squeeze in and fight for our attention.

Tuesday - GPS: Let's remember to pray for guidance. Ask God for what and where He wants you to be praying. He will be a lamp to your feet and a light to your path.

Wednesday - BIBLE: Let's remember how powerful God's Word is. He says He will reach every tribe, people and language. Let's bring our intercessions in line with that promise.

Thursday - DIARY: Let's remember to book time for regular prayer. Satan wants to hold onto this world for as long as he can, so we cannot expect to make spiritual breakthroughs instantly. Jesus set time aside for prayer, so we certainly should.

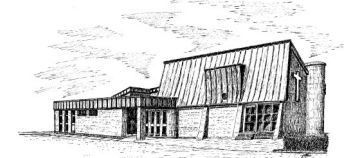
