For this I have Jesus

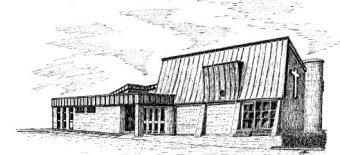
Thursday - For the weakness of my body, for the burdens of each day For the nights of doubt and worry when sleep has fled away.
