


The Church of Scotland

Pray for the new Moderator, The Very Reverend Derek Browning, as he moderates the week's meeting, and as he preaches on Sunday morning in St Giles, Edinburgh and in the afternoon in the Gaelic Church. He has a heavy load this week. Pray for strength, wisdom and enjoyment as he moderates The General Assembly. Our national Councils and Committees offer annual reports to The General Assembly, reports with proposals which are debated and voted upon. It is then for them, and us, to work on the accepted proposals and build God's Kingdom where we are.

Ministries Council are still challenged by the reducing number of Ministers, working on strategies which will spread resources well.

Mission and Discipleship seek to provide resources for a wide range of needs: congregations and worshippers at different stages on their own journey, in different contexts, with different gifts. Often these resources need tweaked to fit however the aim is sure: to grow disciples and to go out and tell the world about God's love for all.

World Mission seeks to find ways to work with our partner churches around the world, and to enable congregations to help as and when they can on specific areas of concern. Rev Rola Sleiman, Syria's first female ordained minister, was initially refused a visa, but pressure saw the decision reversed. Welcoming so many other friends from around the world we will now be able to hear first hand of experiences in conflict, about poverty and need, about faith and hope.

Church and Nation seek to raise awareness of social and political injustices, helping individuals and congregations lobby the people in power on issues that affect creation, equality, justice in a huge variety of areas. They seek to promote and help us to promote good practice, and to speak out gospel principles into all difficulties.

Lord High Commissioner

Each year HM The Queen appoints a Lord High Commissioner as her representative to the General Assembly, unless she attends in person. This year, Her Majesty has appointed HRH The Princess Royal, who previously performed the role in 1996. The Princess Royal will observe the proceedings and report back to Her Majesty what has been debated at the Assembly. The Princess Royal's first official duty will be to take part in the Ceremony of the Keys, held at the Palace of Holyroodhouse the day before the General Assembly convenes -- which this year is Friday, 19 May. The colourful tradition marks the handing over of the keys of the City of Edinburgh by the Lord Provost to the Lord High Commissioner to the General Assembly.

The Princess Royal will also take part in the ceremonial procession at the Opening Session of the General Assembly and will attend the Heart and Soul festival in Princes St Gardens on Sunday, 21 May, as well as undertaking visits elsewhere in Scotland.

Church of Scotland General Assembly 2017 when more than 730 commissioners from congregations across Scotland and beyond will come together to take part in the event, a unique mix of debate, tradition and worship.

Over the course of the week they will be joined by more than 150 people from associated partners and other organisations who work with the Church. The public gallery is open each day for any members of the public who are interested in observing the proceedings.

First held in 1560, the General Assembly is the Kirk's highest court, made up of commissioners who are generally ministers, elders and deacons, as well as youth representatives and around 40 international emissaries from partner churches around the globe. The General Assembly considers reports from each of the Church's councils, discusses issues of national and international importance, and makes decisions that help set the Church of Scotland's direction for the coming years.

Decisions made at the General Assembly can have an historic and long-standing impact on the future of the national Church. However, the Church of Scotland values thoughtful, well considered decision making, and seeks consensus whenever possible, so contentious issues are usually debated for several years before a final resolution is reached.

The theme for this year's General Assembly and Heart and Soul is 'Word of Life'; a rich, multi-layered theme that invites each one of us, whether we are at the heart of faith or on the fringes of faith, to think about what, for us, those words might be: hope, welcome, peace, mercy, kindness, love and so many more. Whilst the words will adapt and change throughout our life journey of faith, they help us understand and give texture to the focus of our faith, Jesus of Nazareth, the embodiment of 'Word of Life'.
